
A Message of Aloha – August 2020

SENIOR SAFE RIDE

In response to COVID-19, Waikiki Community Center is offering Senior Safe Ride, to help seniors get to the grocery store, access basic supplies and get to medical appointments more safely. The program targets seniors who normally take the bus and no longer feel safe on public transportation, and/or do not have the resources to access taxis/ride share services.

WCC will arrange for a ride (pick up and drop off) through the ride share service Lyft. WCC will take care of the scheduling so no technical knowledge is needed for the rider. With funding from Aloha United Way and other generous donors, WCC is able to offer rides free of charge.

To qualify for the Senior Safe Ride program you must be:

- WCC member 60+ years of age and/or have a disability and/or underlying medical condition
- Low-to-moderate income
- Live in Honolulu area

Program Guidelines:

- Rides may be used to get basic supplies (e.g. groceries, pharmacy items, cleaning supplies, etc.) or for medical appointments in the Honolulu area.
- Rides may be scheduled Monday Friday, except holidays between 8am to 5pm
 - Rides to get basic supplies are limited to once a week per household
 - Rides to medical appointments can be scheduled as needed
- Rides must be requested via email or phone at least 24 hours in advance
- Rides for medical appointments can be scheduled up to 7 days in advance
- It is highly recommended that the rider has a cell phone in case of scheduling or location issues
- The rider must be able to wear a face mask at all times during the ride

Give Aloha, Foodland's annual community matching gifts program, was created in 1999 to honor Foodland's founder Maurice J. "Sully" Sullivan and continue his legacy of giving back to the community. Each year during the month of September, customers are encouraged to make a donation at Foodland to their favorite participating Hawaii non-profit organization. Each year, Foodland contributes more than \$250,000 to match customer donations for all organizations combines. Since the program began in 1999, a total of more than \$32.7 million has been raised for Hawaii's charities.

SEPTEMBER 1 – 30, 2020

As a participating organization, **Waikiki Community Center** is eligible to receive donations with matching funds under Foodland's Give Aloha Program.

Donations through this program will be accepted at checkout stands at all Foodland, Sack N Save and Foodland Farms stores statewide from September 1-30, 2020.

Customers must use their Maka`i Card to make a donation and can make up to cumulative total of \$249 per person, per organization. Customers who do not have a Maika`i account may establish one at checkout at no charge.

Foodland and the Western Union Foundation will match each donation up to a total of at least \$250,000 for all organizations combined.

Donations in the form of cash, check or credit card (VISA, MasterCard, American Express, Discover and JCB) will be accepted. The donation amount and name or organization will appear on your receipt.

Donor names will not be released to organizations. Donations are tax deductible to the full extent of the law.
